

#### **El Mundo Digital Archive** Puerto Rico | In Spanish | 1919–1990

Founded in 1919, *El Mundo* (The World) was a respected, conservative newspaper from Puerto Rico and was widely considered a key source for news until it ceased in 1990. Key topics covered by the newspaper include industrialization of Puerto Rican society, the Great Depression, territorial relations with the United States including citizenship and activities of independence movements such as the Macheteros and FALN, the rise of the Popular Democratic Party, the Ponce massacre, the Ley de la Mordaza (Gag Law) and more.

#### Independent and Revolutionary Mexican Newspapers Mexico | In Spanish | 1807–1929

This collection traces the evolution of Mexico during a pivotal, and tumultous, period. Comprising nearly 1,000 titles from Mexico's pre-independence, independence, and revolutionary periods, the newspapers in this collection provide rare documentation of the dramatic events of this era and include coverage of Mexican partisan politics, yellow press, political and social satire, as well as local, regional, national, and international news.

The publications that comprise the Independent and Revolutionary Mexican Newspapers collection have been made available by the Nettie Lee Benson Latin American Collection of the University of Texas at Austin. Important contributions were also made by The Latin American Library of Tulane University.

# El Imparcial

#### Puerto Rico | in Spanish | 1918–1972

This influential, conservative, and pro-independence tabloid in Puerto Rico is perhaps best known for its reportage on political corruption in Puerto Rico in the 1940s and for its unique coverage of the Cuban Revolution (1953-1959). *El Imparcial* regularly covered the US's political and economic control of Puerto Rico, including its extensive coverage of efforts to create the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico. During the first half of the 20th century, it was the most widely read publication in Puerto Rico. #### Noticias Graficas Argentina | in Spanish | 1943–1950


A groundbreaking Argentine newspaper published in Buenos Aires during the first half of the 20th century. Known for its innovative double-page illustrated center spread and high-quality journalism, it was one of Argentina's most prominent evening papers. Despite its closure during the dictatorship of Pedro Eugenio Aramburu, the newspaper's legacy endures. #### El Comercio Digital Archive Peru | In Spanish | 1839–2023

Founded in 1839, El Comercio is the longest-running newspaper in Peru and one of the oldest Spanishlanguage newspapers in the world. It is considered Peru's newspaper of record and is one of the most influential newspapers in South America—with a circulation of over 100,000. Over the years, *El Comercio* has provided unique coverage of important events in Peruvian and South American history. *El Caribe* is a Spanish-language daily newspaper is one of the Dominican Republic's most influential and longestrunning newspapers. Founded in 1948 under the repressive Trujillo regime (1930-1961), *El Caribe* has been a chronicle of national and international news, both for the Dominican Republic and the broader Caribbean region.

Users can browse historical publications as full-image, full-text e-books (in any language), download tabular data in Excel format (for born-digital publications), and download GIS data (e.g., shapefiles of administrative boundaries)—all from a standardized platform optimized for accessibility and discovery.
