Among the most widely circulated newspapers in Nigeria, *Daily Times* has consistently covered important events in Nigerian history, including the discovery of oil in Nigeria (1956), Nigerian Independence (1960), the Nigerian Civil War (1967–1970), the Second Republic (1979–1983), the transition to democracy (1999), and ongoing religious violence (2000–).
